Certificate I in EAL (Access)

This course develops basic English language speaking, listening, reading and writing skills directly related to immediate personal, social and settlement needs including numeracy skills and knowledge.

Where and When:

- Two days per week
- Duration: 2 Years
- Class times: 9.30am to 1.30pm
- Course starts: February 2026. Rolling intake available until classes reach full capacity.
- Location: Maidstone Community Centre
- Delivery method: Face to face

Assessment Method:

- Assessment methods include: Questioning (verbal or written), product Based Method (portfolio, listening text/written answers, reading text, spoken text), direct Observation (role play, discussions)

Pathways:

- Education pathways - As per the ACSF, the exit level of 22638VIC Certificate I in EAL (Access) of ACSF 2 is considered a beginner. Further EAL study is most likely required for employment or study pathways requiring more than a very basic level of English. After achieving this qualification candidate may consider pursuing: 22639VIC Certificate II in EAL (Access)
- Employment Pathways and other pathways could include:
 - Voluntary or paid work
 - Involvement in community organisations
